3 Core	Tenants
1.	Secret Knowledge (gnosis): Believed that they had the secret, inside track to true salvation and everyone else was in the dark.
2.	Dualism: The world is divided into two realms - physical and spiritual. A lesser being (not God) created the physical world, so everything physical is inherently evil and corrupt - incapable of salvation. The soul (spark) is naturally divine, but is imprisoned in the physical world.
