Islam means peace. Therein lies the soul and spirit of Islam. It is ironic that this religion of peace is understood today in the West as the religion of war, terrorism, chaos and disorder. While in reality Islam is not only peace in name, but peace pervades all its teachings, and works as the key to its understanding. If translated literally, the second meaning of the word Islam is submission. So the words peace and submission create a complete picture of Islam. While peace is in relation to the Muslim's attitude to his fellow human beings and also in relation to the deep content he finds in Islam, the word submission describes the attitude of the Muslim to God. So in one single word, the entire philosophy of this religion is summed up.

Islam does not mean "peace" in Arabic in the classic sense of the term. Islam means "surrender." This term carries a significant double meaning. To the Muslim, it evidences his position in the religion—he is willingly surrendered to the rites, rituals, and practices of the religion. The term surrender carries a profoundly different meaning for Islam when applied to the unbeliever. Central to Muhammed's message was the subjugation of the kafir (unbelievers) under Islamic law. Muhammed established Islam as a complete and total world system. It impacts one's beliefs, diet, dress, work, home, politics, and allegiances. As such, Islam is completely theocratic. Simply put, Islam and democracy are mutually contradictory; they cannot coexist. In true Islam, the laws, protocols, ethics, and teachings of Islam are the law of the lan
